IN-PERSON SUNDAY SERVICES:

- Face coverings/ masks will now be compulsory, unless you are exempt to wear one for medical reasons.
- **Singing** will be permitted in our worship services together & **praying** out loud when time allows
- A hand sanitizer station is available on entry to keep our hands clean & minimise any risk of virus transfer
- Please be aware of each other's **social space** and distancing. **Be respectful** if individuals are not yet ready to shake hands or make physical contact and wish to sit with spaces between themselves and others.

NB. For others shielding (due to health concerns) or unable to attend on this occasion, then you can continue to log-in on Zoom to watch the service from home.

CHILDREN'S CHURCH CONTINUES:

Our Junior Church sessions continue every Sunday morning for our 10.30am services. This will mean all children from primary school age 4 up to secondary school age 13 years old can now head out from the main service on a weekly basis at about 11am (when given notice from the front) for their own age-appropriate sessions, activities & teaching with the designated children's ministry team.

Parent(s) who bring children younger than 4 years old must take full responsibility to stay with them throughout the service (NB. Feel free to bring in any activities, books and games for them to play while the service is running.) There is also space for pre-school children to play or interact with other children in the back room where some toys and books will be provided.

YOUR HEALTH & SAFETY IS VITAL:

As part of the plans to gather again, we have done all we can to make sure the venue and service will minimise the risk of any spread of viruses. This has included the following:

- 2x Sanitizer Stations one at the entrance of the venue & one at the exit of the venue
 Please sanitize your hands on entry/exit to the venue AND on entry/exit to the toilet facilities
- Stewarding Team to prepare/ sanitize the room & seats/ rows in preparation of your arrival
- 3. Safe seating plan allowing spaces between the seats/ rows for different families/ couples/ groups/ bubbles etc. to maintain social distancing from others attending
- 4. **Safe Communion** for Communion, then we will not be sharing from the same plate or passing around the communion wine. Instead, we will ask you to **bring your own bread & wine (or juice)** with you and when the bread & wine is taken, you will be allowed to remove your face covering during that time, and put it back on after.
- 5. **Toilets** are available and we'll only be allowing 1 person at time to use the facilities. Someone seated near the facilities entrance will monitor this, so please wait for your turn when occupied.
- 6. Additional awareness remember to wash your hands thoroughly if using the facilities, and refrain from touching items/ furniture in the venue (other than your designated seats/ table) and to minimise physical contact with others attending by your own discretion.

We know that since the lockdown restrictions have eased, many people are still cautious, so let's all continue to be sensible and respectful to one another, and most of all **'fix our eyes on Jesus, the Author and Perfector of our faith'** (Heb 12:2) – because He is the reason we meet, He is the reason we gather, and He is the One who is worthy of all our praises & worship!

'Let us not give up meeting together, but let us encourage one another – and all the more as you see the Day [of Christ's Return] approaching!' (Hebrews 10:25)
